Available Schools	 Tertiary and University System There are undergraduate, graduate, certificate, and diploma programs in various academic and professional fields. The National Accreditation Board (www.nab.gov.gh) lists 140 accredited institutions, both public and private, offering four-year degrees as well as two and three-year diplomas, which are not equivalent to bachelor's degrees, but undergraduate transfer credit can be awarded.
Issues with the Education System	 Low teacher-to-student ratio Poor feeding, inadequate water, and sanitation facilities Shortage of trained teachers and schoolbooks Overcrowding or insufficient infrastructure Children living with disabilities face additional challenges Adolescent girls are often denied opportunities to complete secondary education Peer pressure and involvement in social vices, such as bullying, theft, drug abuse, teenage pregnancy, and truancy
